5. For the purpose of the Building Act 2004 and Building (Dam Safety) Regulations 2022, the 'dam owner' is the person who legally owns the physical dam. Typically, the landowner will also be the dam owner. However, this will not always be the case as there are a variety of different scenarios when it comes to dam ownership. If the owner of the dam is not the same person as the owner of the land the dam is located on, there will likely be a record of this. Generally, where multiple people own the dam, they will collectively be the 'dam owner'. In most cases, it should be apparent who the owner/s of a dam is.
